#### What This Lesson Is About:


This lesson is about Jesus' authority over sickness and death.

### **How This Lesson Can Impact Your Life:**

This lesson can help you face desperate situations with hope, knowing that Jesus has power even over death.

#### A. Jesus Has Authority - Luke 7:1-10

- 1. Jesus entered Capernaum.
  - a. Located on the northern shore of the Sea of Galilee;
  - b. Home town of Peter and Andrew; James and John;
- 2. A centurion's slave, who was highly valued.
  - a. A Roman centurion was a man in charge of 1,000 soldiers in the Roman Army;
  - b. Being a Roman solider and a foreigner, Jews would consider him an unworthy sinner;
  - c. However, this man was considered very kindly;
- 3. He sent some Jewish Elders to Jesus to plead the man's case. "He is worthy." Why?
  - a. Loves our nation probably means he did not treat the Jews harshly as did most of the other Romans;
  - b. Was responsible for the construction of the local Jewish Synagogue (church):
  - c. NOTE: Jesus does not hesitate to go with the Jewish leaders;
    - Jesus used this event to show His disciples and us that His ministry did not have any boundaries.
    - ii. Everyone needs to hear the Good News of Jesus.
- Remains of 1st Century Synagogue in Capernaum
- iii. We must ignore racial, cultural, religious and socio-economic barriers to fulfill the Great Commission.
- 4. Don't trouble Yourself, since I am not worthy, that's why I did not come myself.
  - a. The centurion did not feel worthy to have Jesus come to his house. What is being worthy mean?

- B. Jesus Shows Compassion Luke 7:11-15
  - 1. On His way to a town called Nain.
    - a. On first reading one would not see the connection between this story and the previous one;
    - b. Both stories show Jesus' compassion and authority of His powerful word in action;
    - c. Old Testament Parallel: Nain is the New Testament town of the Old Testament Shunem, the place where Elisha restored a lifeless young boy, the only son of a widow in 2 Kings 4;
  - 2. Nearing the gate of the town, Jesus met a funeral procession.
    - a. Coffins for the Jews was simply a board on which the dead body was carried to the place of burial;
    - b. Burial was usually above ground in a reusable crypt or cave;
  - 3. Seeing the widow and her dead and only son;
    - a. It is a terrible thing for any parent to have to burry a child;

- b. Parents are suppose to die first;
- c. This was the woman's ONLY son; Had the woman other children, they could have provided at very least some comfort;
- d. This woman was a widow; She had already buried her husband;
- e. How grief-stricken would she have been? She has nobody!
- f. Without a husband or a son to care for her, this woman would have had no way of making a living;
- g. She was destitute with no hope for the future;
- 4. Jesus has compassion on her;
  - a. The word "compassion" literally refers to movement of a person's bowls;
  - b. We often use the expression "a gut feeling" to express where the center of one's feelings and emotions are;
  - c. When Jesus has compassion it means that His innards went out to this woman; He felt the pain that gripped this woman with such an intensity that He had to do something about it;
  - d. This is the reason the Church throughout the ages has been commanded to care for widow;
  - e. Our concern for widows mirrors God's interest in their well-being Deuteronomy 10:18;
  - f. For this reason, caring for widows serves as one of the basic expressions of our sincere devotion to God James 1:27;
- 5. Young man, I tell you, "Get up!"

  - a. The widow never asked Jesus to bring her son back to life; Jesus' compassion for her recognizes what is needed and grants it to her;
  - b. There is no comment about the widow having faith in Jesus; Jesus' compassion for her help her in her need without any mention of faith;

  - a. When we see some great and awesome wander, what's your reaction? Why?
  - b. Because we are forced to realize there is something here much bigger and stronger than we are;
  - c. Fear comes when we are forced to acknowledge that somehow God was responsible for what happened; and since what happened was something good...
- 2. They glorified God.
  - a. This sense of awe gave way to sincere worship;
  - b. Their holy fear of God led them to Him praise and glory;

  - a. Did they make the connection to Elisha's rising of the widow son and thus call Jesus a "Great Prophet?"
  - b. Or did they only accept Jesus as a prophet?
  - c. And if so, did they miss the entire meaning of this miracle?
- 4. God has visited His people.
  - a. For other people, the miracle proved one tremendous truth Jesus is God!
  - b. What happened could only be accounted for by God's presence, in Jesus;
